Membership and Art Show: Some News from Vesterheim American Museum

Alberta Murray

The passing of our past president Alberta Murray at 93 years of age was a surprise notice. She was living in Florida with her daughter. Even at age 90, Alberta was driving to take rosemaling classes with her spunky, fun sense of humor. She not only painted for many years, after her retirement she was an active participant in the Senior Olympics winning many gold metals. She was our president in 1981-82 when our membership was approaching 250. She also taught painting at Clements Center in Lakewood. Alberta later moved to near Milwaukee before her Florida move. She occasionally visited when she was in town. I have one of her rosemaled trays.

Sigmund Aarseth

Norwegian Rosemaler Sigmund Aarseth passed away December 12, 2012. He taught the first Rosemaling class at Vesterheim in Decorah lowa in 1967 followed by a number of other teaching visits. He has published several books on the history of Rosemaling, some translated in English. At one point he was loosing his eyesight which they discovered was being caused by an allergy to linseed oil. He also painted landscapes for a period of time. One whole room at Vesterheim was painted by him. His last book "Norway Painted in Color and Light" is available from <u>Vesterheim.org</u> for \$34.95 plus shipping and handling. Museum members may recieve a 10% discount.[I have ordered a copy if you'd like to see it when it arrives.]

Paul and Andy Loftness

If you have ever had a turned wood plate or bowl from Paul Loftness, you will want to treasure it. Paul has been woodturning for 38 consecutive years for Vesterheim. Paul has been working in the field of vision research for over 10 years while he was woodturning in the time available. As of the end of 2012 Paul and his brother Andy have stopped making their turned plates and bowls. Their excellent wood products needed little, if any, sanding before sealing and painting. Their skilled woodturned products will be missed!
