#### **DECOART TIPS**

#### Tips for Using Stencils:

When stenciling on fabric, try adding fine grit sandpaper between the backing board and the fabric, grit side up. The fine grit sandpaper will "grab" the fabric and prevent it from moving or shifting while you are stenciling. (Who knew?)

Properly loading your stencil brush is the key to achieving successful stenciled images. It is best to load the stencil brush and then remove some of the paint creating a "dry brush." To load, apply paint to the bottom bristles of the brush and wipe onto a paper towel prior to stenciling on your project surface.

When stenciling an overall background pattern on your project surface, it is best to begin stenciling in the center of your surface and work out toward the edges. This will ensure that you end up with an even design that is centered and equal at the edges.

I found some **tips** in my files for painting on raw or galvanized tin. I'm sorry to say I do not know who wrote the following tips... therefore I'm sorry to say I can't give any credit to that person. I'm sure these were from a credible source or I would not have saved them, right? <grin>

# TIPS FOR PAINTING ON RAW TIN or GALVANIZED TIN #1 CLEAN IT

Be sure the surface is clean. Wash with a mild soap solution, but rinse with vinegar + water 1:1...then rinse with just water. DRY. Can heat oven to 250 degrees... turn off... place tin in until oven is cool... or allow to dry overnight, or in a hot car. DO be sure it is all dry... even the cracks and crevices, should there be any.

#### #2 PREP IT

I've seen at many craft shows where painters just slap coat after coat of paint on tin, so much so, the built up ridges show, chips are abundant and overall it's just a cheap looking mess. There are several ways to prep raw tin for a factory-like baked on finished look. Some of these were learned from Helen Jeglic, and others I've learned on my own...either way, if you're going to the trouble of painting a design on a piece of tin, the background should look as good as the design itself. Tin is extremely "unforgiving" and every little mark, hair, or even dust particles can show up, especially on a dark background.

Probably the easiest prepping to ready raw tin to accept the basecoat paint is a spray on rust inhibitor, such as (my favorite) Blair "Tole Primer". This comes in a gray matte finish and is a metal primer. Krylon and Rustoleum both make a gray metal primer that works well with acrylics.

My biggest tip for applying the spray is to place the project on a large turn table...spin...and spray away. Shake can vigorously then direct the nozzle away from the surface and begin moving the spray ONTO the surface while still spinning. Fewer drips that way and paint won't concentrate in just one area. Apply sparingly using several light coats, but allow each to dry, usually only a few minutes is required, then spray again until opaque coverage is achieved. I CANNOT URGE STRONGLY ENOUGH THE IMPORTANCE OF DOING THIS OUTSIDE IN A WELL VENTILATED AREA.

#### BASE COAT IT!

When this surface has dried... thoroughly thinned (with water) and well blended acrylic paint can be slip/slapped on using a large (at least 1" filbert) for the applicator. No corners... means no ridges. At least 3 or 4 coats will be necessary to achieve that factory like finished look, but it doesn't take long if using a hair dryer in between coats. It is EXTREMELY important each application is dried before continuing. In fact, I would never paint tin without using a hair dryer because I KNOW when it's dry that way. DO let the surface cool before continuing.

The 1st & 2nd application will look awful, but the 3rd will give one hope, and the 4th is usually quite pleasing. Remember...less is best so keep the applications thin. If your brush begins to "drag" while painting, you need to thin and blend your paint more. Also, a very thick paint will need more water or thinning agent.

#### ANOTHER PRIMER

Another primer that is easy to use, and an alternative to spraying is Delta's Metal Primer. Brush on, allow to dry, and you're good to go using the same method as described above for basecoating color over a spray on primer. While both work very well, if doing a "masterpiece" I would use the Blair Harvest Tole Metal Primer. Since the Delta's Metal

primer is brushed on or even sponged on, if preferred, the surface will not be "quite" as smooth as a spray will allow.

#### Hello Ladies:

Listed below are the supplies you will need for the Aug 29<sup>th</sup>, Judy Patti class.

- ½ sheet 140 # cold press water color paper (not rough)
- Watercolors of choice Judy used blues, greys, purple, yellow, black and white
- Acrylics (Golden fluid acrylics)
- Regular acrylics darks and lights in colors
- Acrylic brushes, watercolor brushes
- Liquin Matt medium and brush to apply it with
- Stamps (large arty with letters) Also letter stamps
- Butcher tray
- Rice paper with no colors some design (Can also get some from Judy)
- Support board
- Acrylic pallet
- Roll of toilet paper with no designs in it



Back in the days before stamping, computers, typewriters, or printing presses, people still had books. Yes they were hand printed by monks and very expensive. Few people could

afford a book. These monks often painted the first letter of a chapter very large, and intricately decorated. Today we call this beautiful art ILLUMINATION.

On October 17 we are offering a class in illumination taught by Renee Jorgenson from Botanic Gardens. It will be held at our regular meeting venue, Garden Plaza, from 9:30 to 3:30. The cost of the class is \$55 and includes a catered lunch plus snacks. Space will be limited, so call for your reservations send your check soon. I will accept checks at the picnic on August 15 at Ginny Sparlin's picnic.

The following is a list of supplies: Graphite pencil, pencil sharpener, white erasure.

- Watercolor pencils: main colors:
  - Scarlet Red.
  - o Ochre Yellow.
  - o Ultramarine Blue,
  - o Emerald Green and
  - Violet, and any additional colors you like to work with.
    - Recommended brands: Caran d"arche Supracolor, Prismacolor, or Derwent.
- Bring your regular colored pencil set.
- 2 Black Pigma Micron pens: .005 and one with a thicker line.
- Gelly Roll pen: gold
- Good quality watercolor paint brushes: 00 and 0 round (good points important)
- Spoon burnishing tool (several will be provided)
- Water container
- Paper Towels
- 12 inch ruler

Renee will provide individual packets with samples of designs to choose from, tracing paper, watercolor paper, burnishing film, gold ink, gouache, reference materials, and giclees of her personal works.

I know you will all be excited to render your own personal ILLUMINATION letter.
