## Melinda Barnes- Tole Chatter/ Website/Travel Seminars

#### TOLE CHATTER

Hello Everyone,

Let's start off with some more Roc Lon tips from Patty Rawlinson:

1. How to Prep:

Roll on paint... no need to seal.

Rolling is important because brushed on basecoats seem to pool when painting canvas type surfaces.

2. Which side to paint on?

You can paint on either side of Roc Lon, I personally prefer the rough side, because I like the texture.

3. How or when to cut the base of the banner:

This depends on whether or not it is a cut out design or a standard flag shape:

If it is a standard Flag shape pre-cut before painting, make sure to leave enough at the top to fold over for hanging.

If it is a cut out design then you cut it out after you paint it.

If you don't use Roc Lon and want to use canvas instead, then you'll need to hem the canvas.

4. How to prevent the edges from curling?

Give the back of the project some weight.

Meaning... give it a base coat or varnish it.

If the back is "raw" and the front is heavy with basecoats and varnish then of course the cloth will have a tendency to pull forward.

I honestly haven't had a problem with this, because I always do something to the back.

Note: The worst curling I have seen was when a customer used "Fini" on a banner, for whatever reason it makes things shiny and really curly

5. How to Hem for hanging:

You have a few choices:

Hem it with a sewing machine

Use Velcro or magnets (I love the magnets)

#### 6. How to finish a banner:

If you are going to hang a banner outside you MUST use an exterior grade varnish (period) I like to keep my products within brand when I can and use Deco Art DuraClear Matte Varnish for my banners and stepping stones!

#### 7. Why use Roc Lon?

Oh My... let me count the ways.

Regular canvas frays.... (messy)

Roc Lon is cheap with no prep! (yay)

Roc Lon comes in wide lengths for a variety of projects (Flexible)

The weight of Roc Lon is perfect for alot of "regular weight" projects.. canvas is soooooo heavy it makes table runners a drag to display!

In 2007, Gaby and four other artists, Susan Abdella, Neadeen Master, Sue Pruett and Donna Richards, came together and launched the first ever online art community of its kind, the Art Apprentice Online, LLC. On Gaby's site there are video clips that you can watch and learn from as well as online painting lessons. The site may be under construction as I found a couple of links not working yet. CARDS - Peni Powell (This was an old post on Tolefriends, but may be helpful)

I like to make the card 5 1/2" x 4 1/4" or a tad smaller depending on note card size envelops that are readily available at most craft or paper stores. I then will print out 4 of the pictures on one sheet of card stock. Making each picture about 3 1/2"X 3 1/2" CARD STOCK ...Cut each photo out. I find what works best and gives a nice finish to photos from my printer is 65# Bright White and it has a bit of a gloss finish. Another nice idea is to use color craft paper in Red or Green cut just so about a half 1/2"or less is showing all around the picture once you mount the picture. I like to add

a tad of glitter and this can be done by using DecoArt Twinkle writer glitter like maybe in the holly berries to make the card more festive. Or maybe some white glitter in the snow.

I guess I'd better get off this computer for a change and find my paint brushes if I want to enter a painted piece for the art show! \*grin\*

- Graphite pencil, pencil sharpener, white erasure.
- Watercolor pencils: main colors:
  - Scarlet Red.
  - o Ochre Yellow,
  - Ultramarine Blue,
  - o Emerald Green and
  - Violet, and any additional colors you like to work with.
    - > Recommended brands: Caran d"arche Supracolor, Prismacolor, or Derwent.
- Bring your regular colored pencil set.
- 2 Black Pigma Micron pens: .005 and one with a thicker line.
- Gelly Roll pen: gold
- Good quality watercolor paint brushes: 00 and 0 round (good points important)
- Spoon burnishing tool (several will be provided)

- Water container
- Paper Towels
- 12 inch ruler

Renee will provide individual packets with samples of designs to choose from, tracing paper, watercolor paper, burnishing film, gold ink, gouache, reference materials, and giclees of her personal works. There is a \$3.00 charge for these supplies.

I know you will all be excited to render your own personal ILLUMINATION letter.
