Painting Tip... Tracy Moreau

Having trouble getting just the right amount of water in the brush?? (Floating, shading Highlighting etc.)

Paper towel or Shop towels for blotting, often takes out too much and not blotting leaves too much in.... try blotting your brush on a damp cellulose Sponge. (Kitchen sponge)

Wet the sponge thoroughly, and squeeze the excess water out. The sponge should be wet but not drip when squeezed. it is now dry enough to draw the excess water from your brush without removing all of it. (You also won't pick up any fuzzy bits... fuzzy bits drive me nuts) https://tracymoreau.net/

SpectraFix Dega Fixative is non-toxic, order free, all natural and water based. This product is in a pump spray bottle. I ordered it from Amazon and also an empty spray bottle which has an ultra-fine spray. I thought how perfect for us in Colorado when you can't spray outside. So far, I have only tried to use it once and I'm not sure it will work as I expected. There are many YouTube videos on how to use this product. you can check out.
